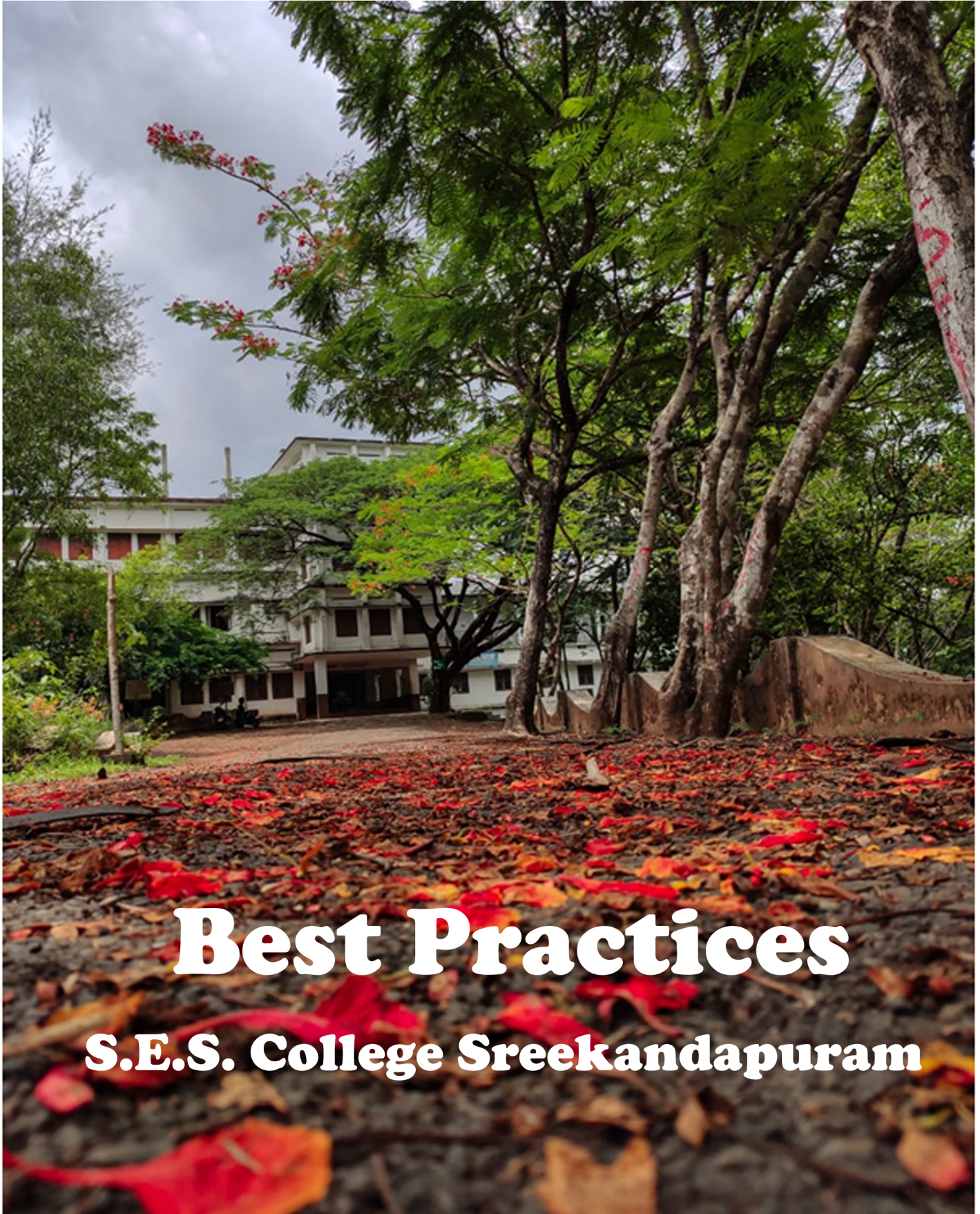

The context that required the initiation of the practice

Teenage period is a period of confusions and emotional turmoil; also faces difficulty in taking decisions. In order to mould our students and help them to accept the right path in their life, the service of a professional counsellor is very essential. So to meet these requirements, our college started a Counselling centre. Counselling is the service offered to the individual who is undergoing a problem and needs professional help to overcome it. Our counselling centre's primary mission is to provide effective counselling services to students who come to us with a wide range of problems.

The Practice

The students can approach the counselling centre at any time. The class teachers and department heads also refer to the cases. All the students are free to approach the counselling centre. Smt. Sunitha Joseph, Co-ordinator of the centre and PGDCP holder (Post Graduate Diploma in Counselling and Psycho-therapy) meet the students in the free hours and consult the cases. Yearly counselling camps are organised for the first year students in which external professional Counsellors also participate; through such sessions, students get an orientation towards the necessity of counselling for a healthy life. In certain cases, counselling facilities are given to the parents also. The practice of counselling and psychotherapy depends on gaining and honouring the trust of clients. The students feel free and comfort with the counselling.

Evidence of Success

Guidance and counselling help the students for their optimum development and realise the relevance of adequate emotional flexibilities in the varied life situations. Various students have benefitted from the counselling sessions and have gratefully expressed positive gestures after becoming successful in life. It helps the students to achieve highly in the education, profession, vocation, social, health,

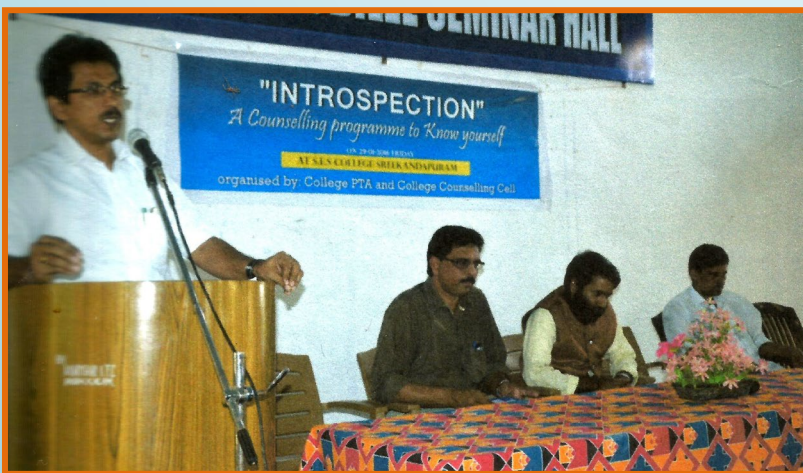
moral, personal and marital areas. Counselling is a process of assistance extended by an expert in an individual situation to a needy person.

Problems faced and Resources required

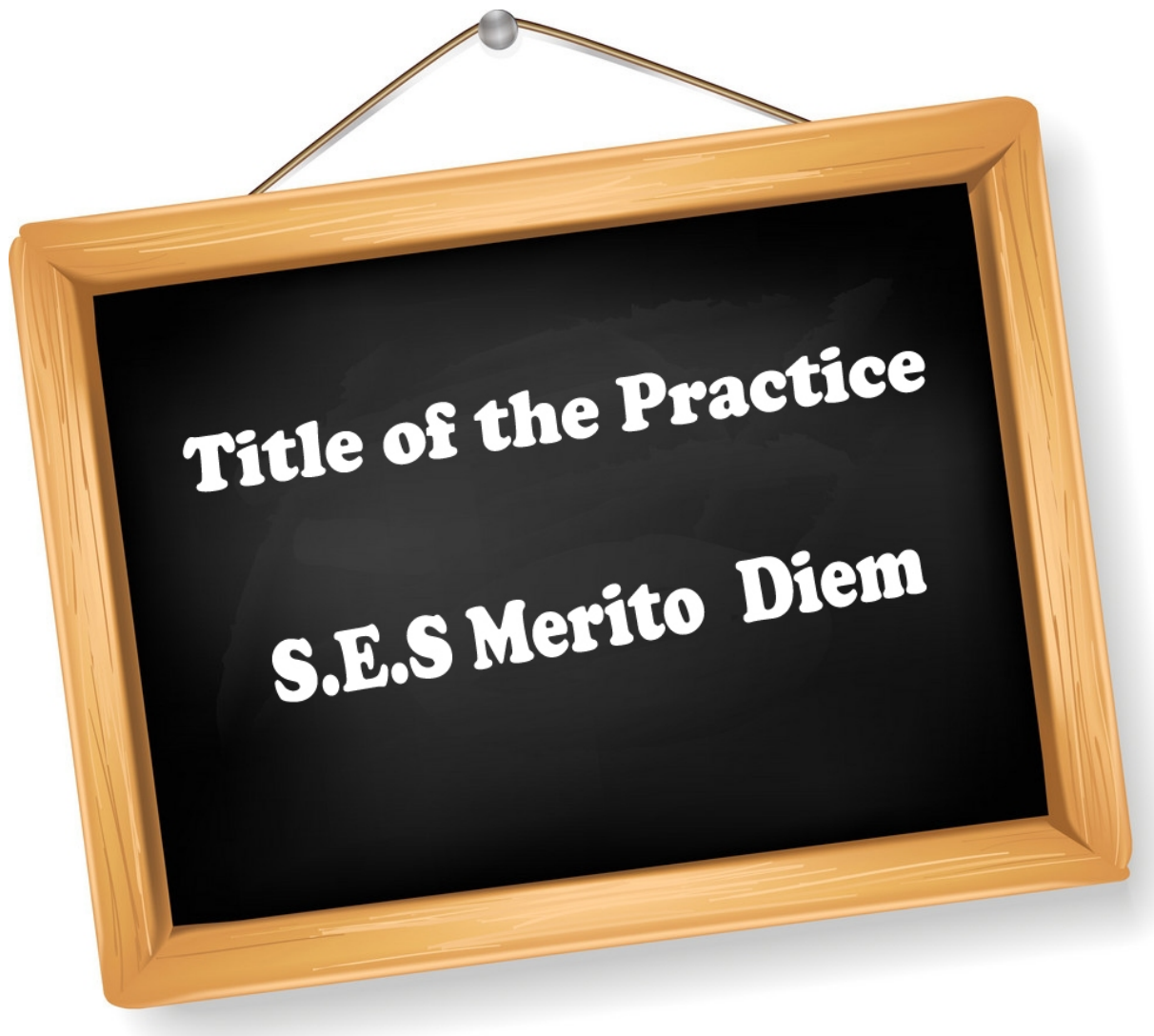
The general attitude of the common man that counselling is meant for those who suffer from some sort of mental sickness is the main problem faced by us too. Students, both the student receiving counselling and the other students, do not take counselling from a broader view that includes any sort of counselling or guidance that may help the student in the betterment of his/her emotional or psychological or spiritual or mental aspects. In the beginning stage of arranging the counselling classes and counselling camps, students are reluctant to attend it because of the thought that only the student with mental difficulty or disability attends such sessions. Lack of awareness of counselling among the students and the failure in identifying the difference between a Counsellor, a Clinical Psychologist, and a Psychiatrist are the obstacles we face. Frequent awareness campaigns by teachers can only help the students in changing their misconception about Counselling. We experience a lot of improvement in the attitude of students. A special and separate room is allotted for student counselling in order to keep the privacy and confidentiality of the counselling process.

The context that required the initiation of the practice

The location of our college creates a geographical gap between other major institutes of our state as it is located in a remote and hilly area of Sreekanthapuram Kannur. Our institute caters to the learning needs of the students from the nearby and deprived people of our localities. The college found out that some sort of motivation is required in order to bridge the gap. The brainstorming in this aspect gave birth to the idea of initiating endowment to appreciate the talents and to motivate the ones about to come to & make their stride in the walks of life. There is a gap in the learning capability of students, some of them are advanced learners, some are slow learners and some are average learners. Advanced learners need more exposure to learning experience, average learners need to come forward and slow learners need more support. In order to provide equity to both the slow learners and advanced learners, we give opportunity for the advanced learners to expose their knowledge and thereby help the slow learners benefit from it.

The Practice

'Merito diem', the Merit day is a flagship programme coordinated by the faculty of our college. The college acknowledges the efforts put forward by the students in achieving excellence in academic and non academic fields of endeavour. The programme distributes endowment for the ones who have left their imprints of success in the respective academic year. A set of 40 endowments are bestowed to the ones who honoured the college by being part of its proud Alma mater. Apart from the department toppers, the college honours subject toppers, best sports person (male and female), NSS volunteers, NCC volunteers and the best user of the college library are honoured and recognized during this ceremony. The Best Student Teacher award is distributed during this event. The tutors identify the

learning ability of the students by proper internal assessment and mentoring. Tutors initiate the “student teacher” programme among the students. Here the advanced learners among senior students are given the opportunity to teach and share with their juniors on the ideas discussed in the curriculum. Some departments give cash awards and recognition (‘Best Student Teacher’ award by English and Chemistry Departments) to those student teachers on the basis of their performance.

Evidence of Success

The students have shown signs of improvement and a renewed enthusiasm for nurturing their talents . The rapid increase in the number of endowments initiated from 4 to 40 is self evident of the success of the practice. Toppers in various depts, in individual subjects, best performers in various arts and sports events, students who represented college and brought home laurels of victory at various levels: national state and university levels are honoured in the presence of our luminous alumni. The honouring was indeed a great boost of confidence and motivation for the students of upcoming years ahead to achieve great heights. The whole college witnessed the celebration of victory from the last academic year. Our institution also encourages the practice of peer teaching. 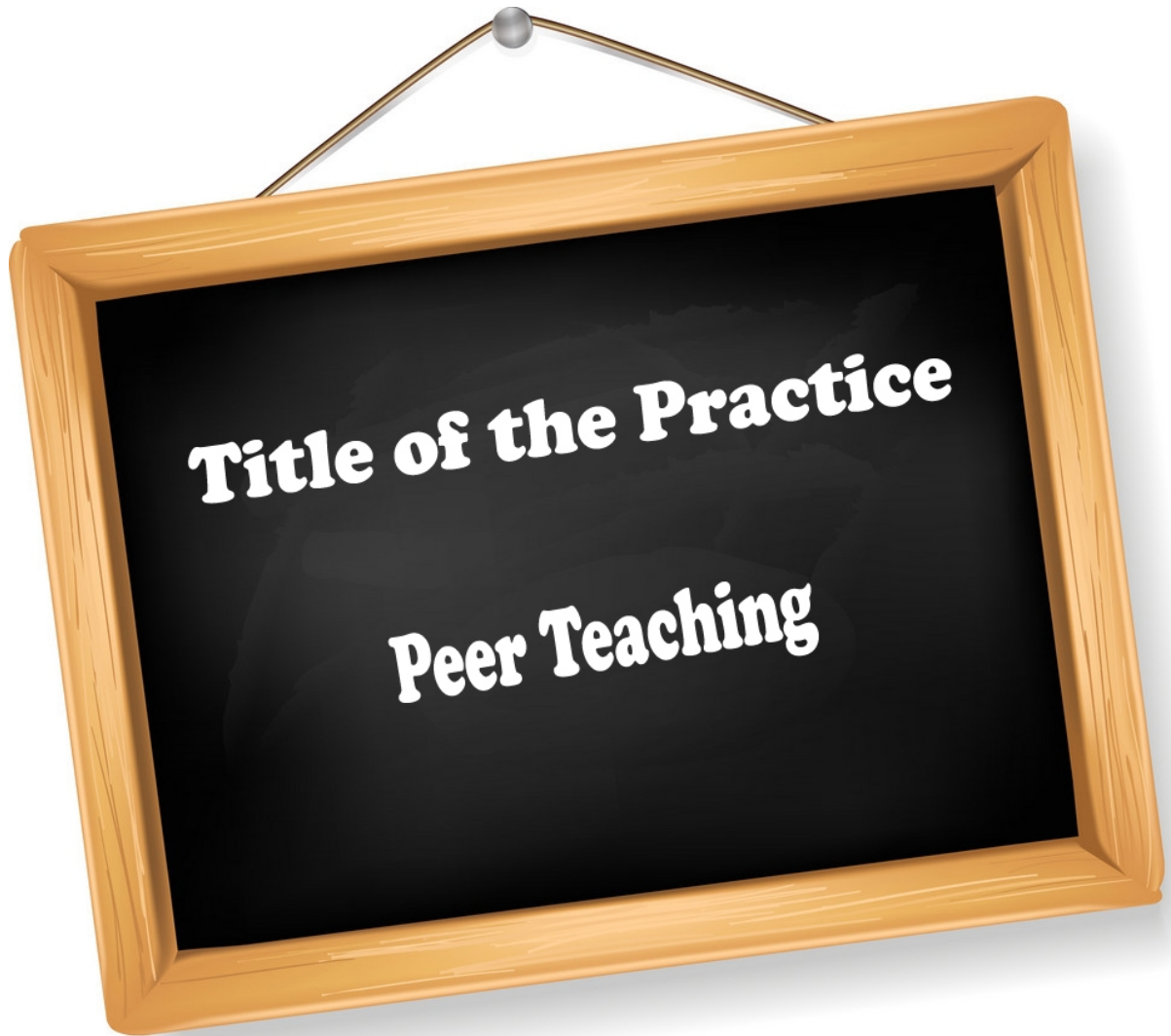
Resources required

Peer Teaching

The context that required the initiation of the practice

The college is located in the sub urban and hilly areas of Kannur district of Kerala. We cater to the learning needs of the students from the nearest localities. There is a gap in the learning capability of students, some of them are advanced learners, some are slow learners and some are average learners. Advanced learners need more exposure to learning experience, average learners need to come forward and slow learners need more support. In order to provide equity to both the slow learners and advanced learners, we give opportunity for the advanced learners to expose their knowledge and thereby help the slow learners benefit from it.

The Practice

The tutors identify the learning ability of the students by proper internal assessment and mentoring. Both groups of students are equally treated by the tutors by initiating the ‘student teacher’ programme among them. Some departments give cash awards and recognition to those student teachers on the basis of their active involvement. We have a formal and informal system for this. The students who are more efficient always support the fellow students to come forward. Some departments follow the system of advanced learners among the senior students teaching the junior ones. Normally the teachers identify a leader in each group and he/ she will be the person having a good score in internal assessment. Informally, before the exams, students prefer group studies and the college provides the classrooms for their group studies. The advanced learners share the value points and important concepts with the slow learners. Practical project works are also done as group work in BBA.

Evidence of Success

The advanced students are able to learn the subjects more thoroughly with the experiential learning mode of Peer Teaching method and it improves their performance in the exams and future life. The methodology proved to be a vast success that the peer teacher-students are keenly interested in the profession of teaching. The slow learners are able to understand the topic well and write the exam more confidently. The average learners also get benefited by improved knowledge and skill. It minimises the failure of students in exam, increases the confidence of the students, improve the relationship among students, minimise the dropout ratio, create more interest and enthusiasm towards learning

Problems faced and Resources required

The identification of weaker students at the beginning of the academic year is difficult, because marks in the Higher Secondary exams are not always an apt indicator. After the internal assessment, the tutors try to identify the slow learners and advanced learners and start peer teaching. The number of students attending peer teaching classes is comparatively low because the slow learners feel some inferiority complex to attend the peer teaching classes. Moreover, the advanced learners also feel hesitated in the beginning to engage sessions. After a month or so, participation of students increases due to the frequent interaction of teachers with slow learners; motivation from the tutors helps the slow learners to avoid their inferiority complex and actively participate in peer teaching. It requires a proper system for identifying the different levels of students. Normally the internal assessment system is used for this. But depending on the internal assessment for the classification of students is again another obstacle. The library facilities, teaching aids such as LCD projector and laptops are the resources required.

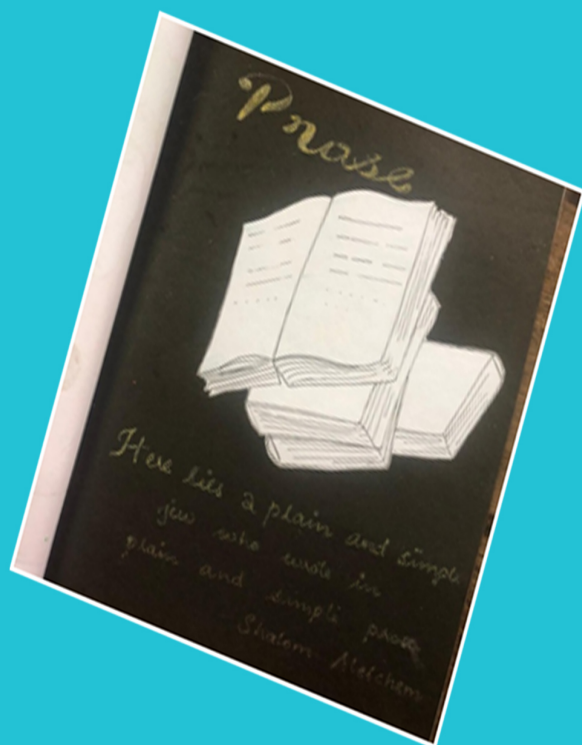

Evidence of Success

The enthusiasm with which the students took part in the venture itself is the greatest evidence of its success. The programme was a real eye-opener for the student community allowing them to think ecologically and more oriented towards sustainable developments rather than concrete constructions, turning our mother nature into concrete maze/ jungle.

Problems faced and Resources required

The general attitude of the modern man that everything in nature is for our pleasure or for us to exploit and humans are even above the laws that bind all other things in nature is subconsciously being imprinted on the students too. 

Connecting with the Community

The context that required the initiation of the practice

The rural communities surrounding the college deserve an active and efficient academic intervention of a Higher Education institution. The students of the college deserve several opportunities for getting exposure. Students who are part of Peer Teaching scheme are given an opportunity to take class for the school students of nearby communities. Under the aegis of the Department of English, students are given an opportunity to enhance their teaching skills by taking class to the school students.

The Practice

Through the Peer Teaching programme, some departments follow the system of advanced learners among the senior students teaching the junior ones. The Peer Teaching Programme was taken to the next level by extending the service of peer Teachers to the nearby community. The willing peer teachers of the Department of English were given an opportunity to teach in Sal Sabeel School, Sreekandapuram on March 7, 2018. The programme "Connecting to community" was launched as an extension of Peer Teaching Programme which would enable the students to have a real classroom teaching experience and also help in establishing an academic relationship with the nearby community. Students of English Department handled sessions on Grammar and some motivating lives. They took classes to the Upper Primary class students and they too enjoyed the different experience. Mr. Baby Thomas, Head of English Department, Mrs. Shabeena Backer and Mrs. Shyna Janardhanan, faculty members of English Department, accompanied the students. The students also gave positive feedback. It also helped the peer teachers to improve their methods of teaching.

Evidence of Success

The Connecting to Community Programme was too fruitful that the student teachers really cherished the experiential learning initiative. It was a first ever experience for them that they could teach in a school. The certificates provided by the

school made the students feel that they have made a great achievement which they expressed through their words.

Problems faced and Resources required

As it was a firsthand experience, students had great nervousness about how to implement the classroom management. Even though the school students co operated in a very good manner, the students cum teachers were really tensed about how to deal the situation. The presence of their teacher and other teachers also increased their nervousness. But once the starting problem was over, student teachers were easily able to manage the scenario. Teaching aids were the resources required.

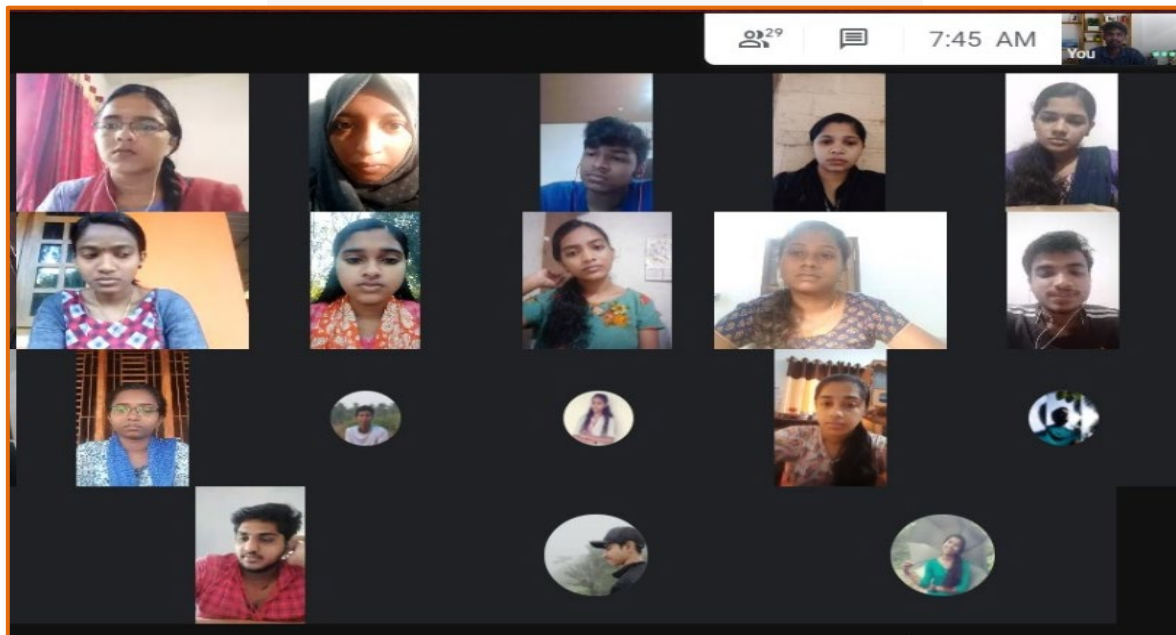

The context that required the initiation of the practice

Mobile phones have become part and parcel of everyone’s life and so the teaching learning process cannot also proceed further without making use of m-learning tools. Several mobile applications are now available to enhance knowledge of various disciplines. But all the learning applications and tools create some sort of hesitation among some students as they treat it only as a complicated foreign tool. Thus nowadays educational thinkers advocate integrating social media platforms itself to teaching learning contexts as students are easily able to adapt to the ambience of those platforms. So the various departments of our college also have shifted to the social media arenas, especially Whatsapp groups to manipulate it as an effective teaching learning tool.

The Practice

Various teachers have created Whatsapp groups to transfer learning materials - some provide audio clips on topics from courses, some provide web links of various educational websites, some conduct Oral tests, quizzes, etc. Advanced learners are also given opportunities to share their ideas on the topics concerned. Students also raise doubts on the classes taken and difficult portions. And to be specific, students make use of the Whatsapp group to make active discussion during examination times. And as there is the presence of the teacher, students cannot make any trivial chats too.

It helped in creating a healthy team building and co operative mentality among students. Teachers are also compelled to shift their positions from sages to mentors and friends.

Evidence of Success

Students actively participate in the m learning happening through Whatsapp. Several parents have also extended positive remarks on the academic development of their children through the use of Whatsapp as a learning tool. Earlier, the main complaint from parents was that their children are fully engaged in mobile phones, especially whatsapp. It is this complaint that compelled the teachers to manipulate it as an effective teaching learning tool. The weak learners are also happy about the fact their main tool of chatting online has turned out to an effective learning tool. Moreover they are getting easy access to the teacher. Students who are nervous about asking doubts and apprehensions in direct classes are able to raise their queries without fearing anything. The relationship between the teacher and students has also become an amicable one.

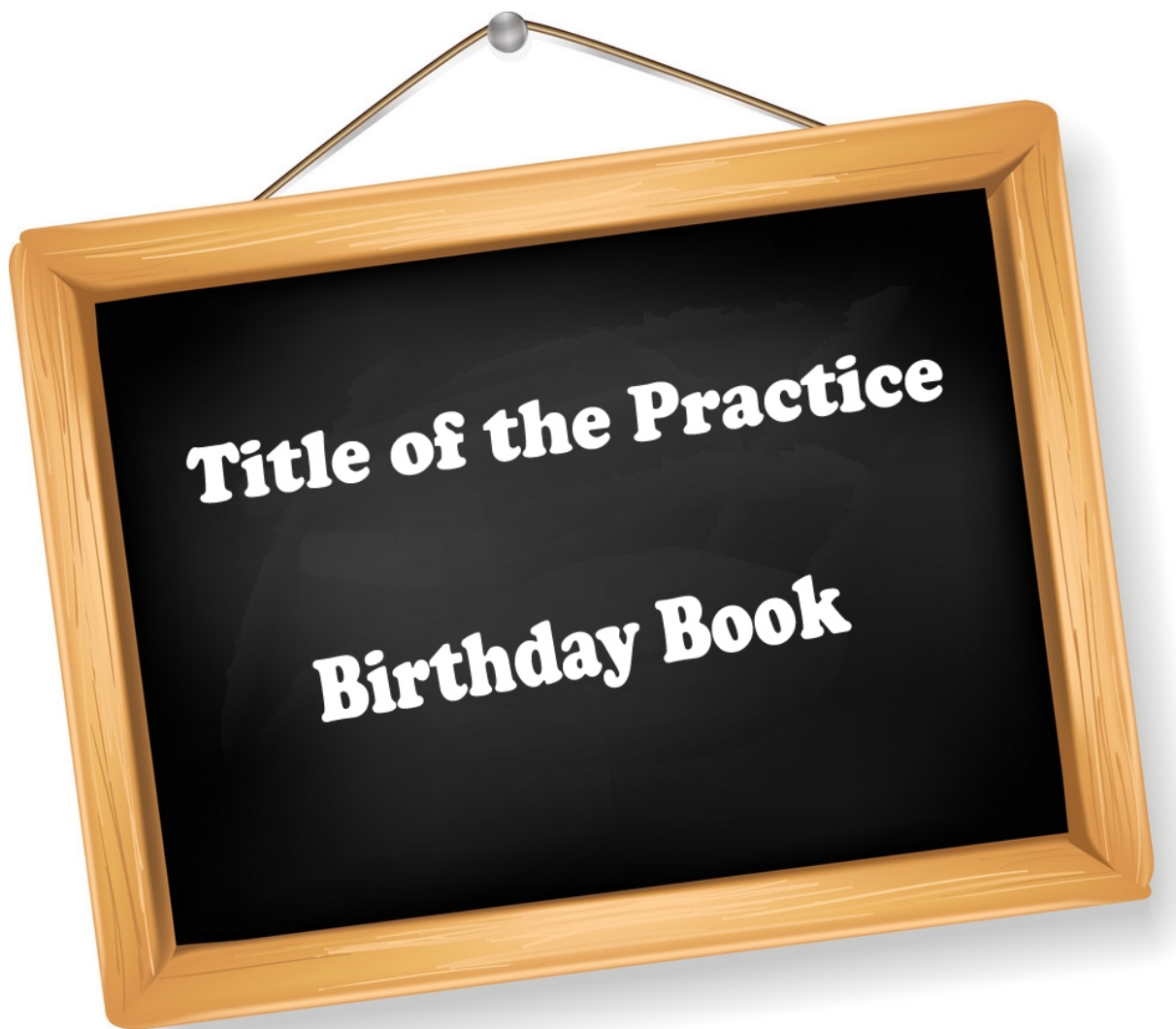
Problems faced and Resources required
