2.ACTIVITY REPORT

SES COLLEGE STUDENT'S UNION 2018-19

It is an abbreviated version of the creative and diverse union activities undertaken within the framework of the time without interfering with academic activities.

We strongly believe that in this world where rivalries and hatred are spreading its roots, we have successfully fulfilled our responsibility to shed light upon the right direction and in directing towards proper politics.

1.College Union Election 2018.

For the first time in the history of SES College, 18 candidates who were part of the progressive student movement were elected unopposed in the college union elections held on August 31 under the guidance of the Lindo Commission.

2. A helping hand for survival. (10.09.18)

Sreekandapuram and the surrounding areas, including the college, were the worst hit by the 2018 floods. The union stepped in for flood relief even before it's official launch. Sanitary napkins and other essentials collected from the college were handed over to Union General Secretary. C.Sreya, Vice Chairman C. Anusree and Navaneetha Damodaran led the distribution in the flood affected areas.



3. Onam of survival

As part of the reconstruction of flood-ravaged Kerala through Onam, the Onam celebrations at the college were canceled and the 'Onam pookalam of survival' was arranged at the college, avoiding the 'onam pookalam' competition organized by the associations. A light 'Onam sadya' was also prepared.



4. Donation to CMDRF (12.09.18)

The Rs 35,000 collected by the union for the Onam celebrations was handed over to the principal to be donated to the Chief Minister's Disaster Relief Fund.



5. Oath taking ceremony (03.10.18)

The investiture ceremony of the union office bearers was held on October 3, 2018 at the seminar hall, marking the official start of the union activities for the year 2018-19. Dr. Dominic Thomas administered the oath of office at the swearing-in ceremony. Kannur District Panchayat President KV Sumesh was the guest of honor at the function. Staff Advisor Sheela M Joseph welcomed the gathering and Chairman Arjun Kalliad presided over the function. General Secretary C Sreya thanked the audience.



6. How to learn, How to win

37. Collection centre
